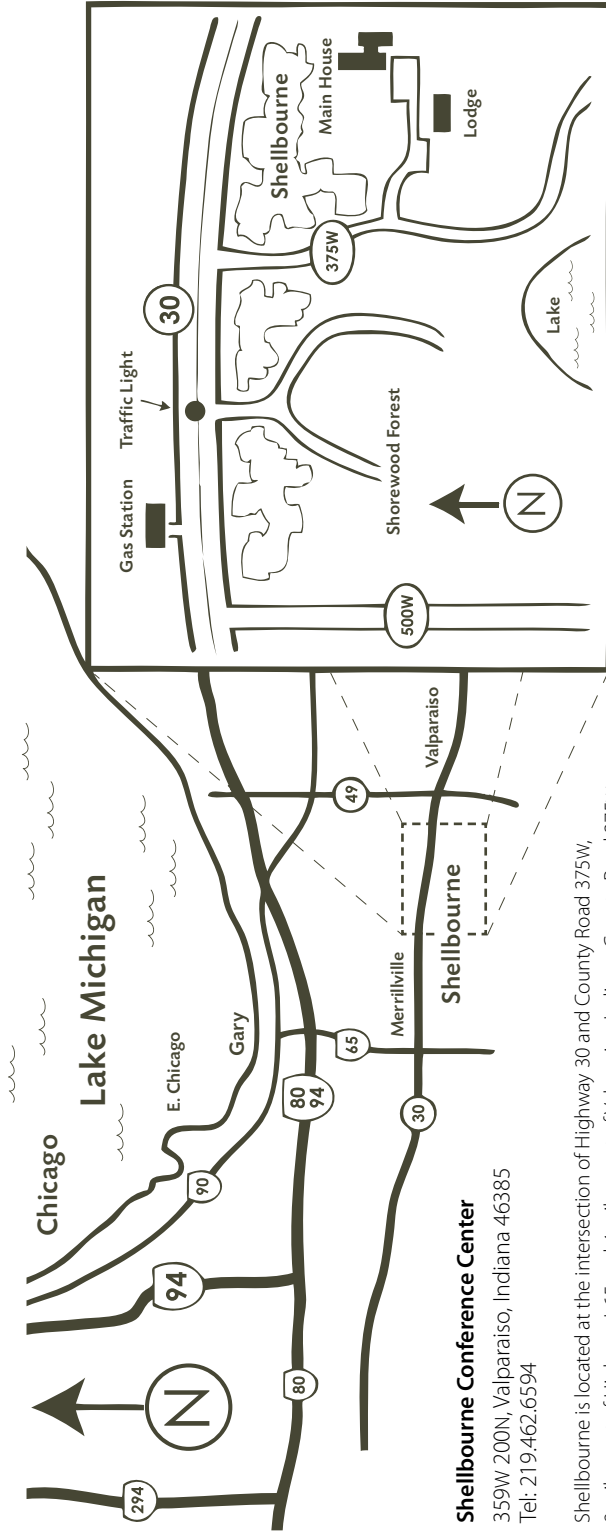

As priests and future priests, we are not immune to the present culture of activism and frenetic activity. The demands on a priest can be quite daunting: the heavy workload of funerals, weddings, baptisms, care for the sick, and parish administration falls on the shoulders of the parish priest. How do you avoid burn out, disillusionment, and a loss of priestly zeal?

Priests and bishops who preach and give witness to the Gospel with authority and enthusiasm, draw nourishment from the contemplation of the word of God in the Liturgy of the Hours, the Liturgy of the Eucharist, and in personal prayer. Ongoing study of the word of God helps the priest hear the voice of the Holy Spirit. This seminar aims to cultivate a greater fascination with the Divine Word, empowering priests and seminarians to inspire this appreciation in the people entrusted to our pastoral care.
